

## KPMG VirtualPC

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VirtualPC provides KPMG professionals access to internal resources, such as e-mail and global Intranet, via a standard Internet Web browser.

VirtualPC provides quick and convenient access to your KPMG e-mail account via Outlook and allows you to:

- View, save and modify Microsoft Office attachments (Word, Excel, PowerPoint)
- Create new files with standard MS Office applications
- View Acrobat (.pdf) files
- Access or extract compressed (.zip) files

### How to get KPMG VirtualPC?

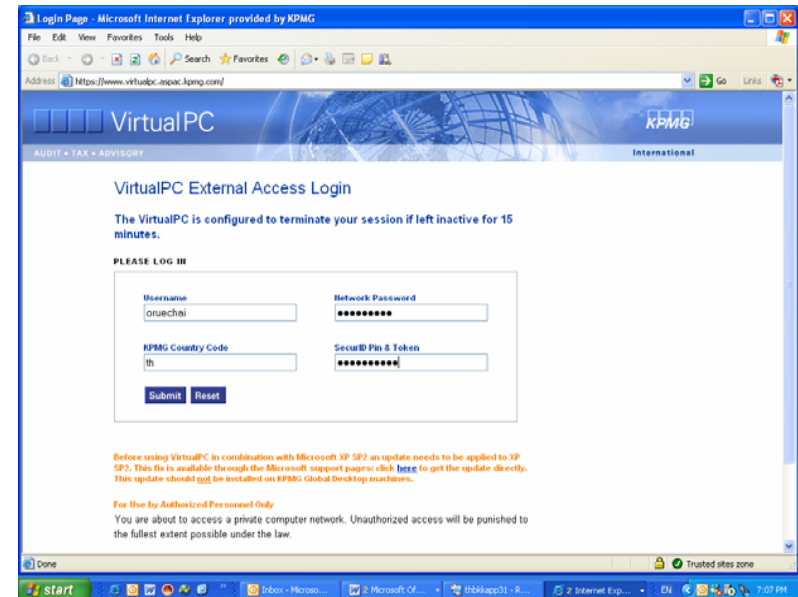
KPMG VirtualPC is available for all KPMG member firms and is accessible through Internet (i.e. Dial-up connection, Internet Café or KNet connection).

### Where to find URLs for accessing KPMG VirtualPC?

From [www.kpmg.co.th](http://www.kpmg.co.th)

- 1) Select **About KPMG**, and then select **Employee Access**
- 2) Click on **VirtualPC**
- 3) Enter your login details for the following fields:
  - User Name:** Country Windows User name
  - Network Password:** Country Windows Password
  - KPMG Country Code:** Country Windows Domain (e.g. TH)
  - SecureID and Token:** PIN and Token number

### 4) Click the **Submit** button



- 5) Double Click on Outlook Shortcut to connect to mail system
- 6) Double Click on Internet Browser to connect to TWorld or KWorld

### Note:

For security reasons, the VirtualPC browser itself does not provide access to external Internet based site. You can however obtain external internal access by opening another browser session on the machine on which you are working. For example, if you receive an external URL in an e-Mail, you can copy and paste from the VirtualPC screen to a local browser and access the site from there.

## KPMG WebMail

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KPMG WebMail is a global remote access solution that provides KPMG employees with access to their e-mail account and public folders via a Web browser on **any Internet-connected device**. With KPMG WebMail you can read and send e-mail messages, organize contacts and schedule meetings.

### When to use KPMG WebMail?

KPMG WebMail offers a backup method that only requires an Internet connection and a Web browser. KPMG WebMail can ideally be used in situations where the primary remote access solutions, such as VirtualPC and Global VPN are not available.
